Correspondence with the Club included a congratulations on a job well done with respect to the Huntington Beach clean up that was held on May 5th. The Bike to School project has become so successful that they no longer require funding from the Bay Village Kiwanis Club. Bay Kiwanis will be funding the Safety Town Tee shirts again this year.

Bay Village Kiwanis also approved funding the purchase of \$250 of food items from Costco. \$5083 payment to complete the Bay Kiwanis Pledge to the Eliminate project was approved. Key Club Lt Governor travel funds for attending the upcoming convention was approved for \$300. Pat M. is putting together a proposal for funding the Bay High School Field of Dreams project.

Under Youth Services, \$125 was approved for the Drug Awareness Poster Awards as requested by Kathy Winzig. Bay Kiwanis approved the funding of up to \$400 for the Safety Town tee shirts. The shirts will include a Bay Village Kiwanis Logo. \$120 each of funding for both the Bay Middle School Builders Club and Westerly K Kids for their end of year party .

St Raphael's Builders Club is making plans for their end of year Prayer Walk to be held on May 24th. They set up eight stations around the block where prayers are repeated for the World Church, the Nation, the Leaders of our Country, our Armed Forces, all Safety Forces, Police, Fire, First Responders, Teachers, Parish Staff, and fellow Students. The entire school stops by each station. The Builders Club was also busy preparing for the Peace Week Book Drive. New or gently used books are collected to donate to the poor.

The Key Club currently has 141 members, 49 of which are new.
